



A new church has launched in Athens sponsored jointly by **First Baptist Watkinsville** and **Prince Avenue Baptist Church** called **5 Points Church**. As you might guess, if you are familiar at all with the layout of Athens, it is in the 5 Points area. Currently it is meeting in the Campus View Church building on Lumpkin Street at 4 p.m. on Sundays. The Lead Pastor is **Joel Shinpoch** who was formerly on staff as the Executive Pastor at Watkinsville First Baptist. We will be glad to have this church as part of Sarepta. As such, I would encourage you to be praying for them as they lay the foundation this church. If you have a prayer list at your church, add them to your prayer list and be praying for them each week as your church gathers. There are many challenges that new churches face both physical and spiritual.

We have currently six churches that do not have pastors: **Apple Valley** (Jefferson), **Pleasant Grove** (Neese), **Beaverdam** (Commerce), **Berea**, **Central** (Athens), and **Cave Springs** (Jackson County). All of these churches have bi-vocational pastors churches. One of the trends that is taking place in our state is the growing number of bi-vocational churches and the declining number of candidates to fill the pulpits. Please be praying for these churches. Several of these churches have be multiple years without a pastor.

The National Day of Prayer is just around the corner, the first Thursday in May. I think you would agree with me that our nation is in great need of prayer in light of the elections that will take place later this year. Pray that our nation, which seems to have drifted from the values that it was founded upon, will return to those values. Pray that our nation would view the phrase "In GOD we Trust" as more than a slogan but rather as a testimony as to how we live our lives. I hope you will make plans to spend part of the National Day of Prayer, praying for our nation to return to God.

As I walk by the class now, inevitably the class members are leaning toward the middle of the circle of chairs, totally engaged in the conversation.
