#### 2022 Updates and Changes to the Christmas Backpacks Program

- Sarepta will not be collecting or transporting backpacks.
- Churches that already have an established relationship with a site in Appalachia are encouraged to communicate directly with that site and deliver backpacks to the site.



- Churches can register to adopt or partner with a ministry site in Georgia and can transport backpacks to that site. Registration is required!
- Churches can prepare backpacks for an unspecified location, and transport those to a designated collection site. Registration is required!
- The Christmas Story, which is to be included in each backpack, is to be printed out by churches, rather than mailed from GBMB.

Covid really locked down certain ministries. That was certainly true of the Block Party Trailer. Last year we saw a little activity but this spring and summer has really cranked up the use of the trailer. Those churches who have used it this year: Academy, Arnoldsville, Beaverdam, Cleveland Road, Green Acres, Hull, Madison Street, Meadow, New Harmony, Rogers and Winterville FBC. We received great reports from our churches on how this tool is being used.

#### Sarepta's Mission Georgia Team

Our Mission Georgia Team was formed back in February. The purpose of this team is to engage in developing the five areas of the Mission Georgia emphasis in the Georgia Baptist Mission Board. Those five areas are: Childhood Literacy, Foster Care and Adoption, Refugees and Internationals, human trafficking, and pre and post-natal care. We are not going to tackle all of these at the same time.

- Our team has chosen to focus on Foster Care and Adoption. It will be a slow roll out as we get up to speed on what that is going to look like. The first emphasis our team will be recommending to our churches is Stand Sunday (Orphan Sunday) November 13th. All the information you will need to promote that is found at CAFO.org.
- The other area that is being emphasized is featured on the front page of the Vision and that is Read Georgia. There will be an informational gathering on Thursday, September 29th. If you have an interest, please make plans to attend.
